JOB SUMMARY

To assist in the delivery of high-quality football and sports coaching sessions within our schools, focussing on PPA, Lunchtime Clubs; After-School Clubs and supporting when required, with the PLCF funded Premier League Primary Stars programme.

This role provides front-line representation of the Foundation. As such, it requires the post-holder to possess the highest standards of presentation and to uphold the Foundations values at all times.

- Building and growing relationships with local stakeholders.
- Short & Medium-Term planning across the academic year.
- Support with the recruitment of new partner schools.

- Creating and developing relationships with local schools and participants.
- Maintaining the welfare and safeguarding of children and young people.
- Producing session plans and schemes of work session delivery, ensuring the learning is age appropriate and of high quality.

- Working closely within the Foundation implementing a strategy to grow the Football and Sports Participation programme, which includes:
 - Liaising with Line Manager and agreeing KPIs.
 - Attending relevant meetings (internally and externally).
 - Attending continuous professional development events, where necessary; and
 - Creating effective working relationships with stakeholders and colleagues.
- Ensuring programmes are delivered to a high standard and incorporate relevant safeguarding and health and safety procedures, including:
 - Creating risk assessments for all sessions, within remit.
 - Providing ongoing advice and support to sessional coaches and volunteers working within Football and Sports Participation.

- Adhering to the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 and any related legislation; and
- Promoting the Foundation's policies, rules and procedures on health and safety.
- Working with the Football and Sports Participation Manager to plan, deliver and review the School Sports programme, including:
 - Meeting regularly to ensure projects are on track and meet KPIs set by manager.
 - Working collaboratively with coaches to plan lessons and share resources; and
 - Delivery of the programme in local schools.
